



APPROVED FRAMEWORK FOR THE CHAPTER OF CONSERVATION ARCHITECTS

LAST UPDATED: JUNE 2026

BOARD OF ADMISSION

A Board of Admissions made up of full members within the Chapter of Conservation Architects will be set up to vet applications for affiliation and determine whether the respective applicant can be considered. The Board of Admissions shall consist of three full members that would review applications during two application periods per year. Members of the Board/s shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year and can be reconfirmed depending on their availability. The Board/s will be made up as follows:

- The First Board of Admissions shall be set up to review applications for Fellow affiliation.
The board shall exclusively consist of Fellow Conservation Architects.
- A Second Board of Admissions can be set up to review applications for 'Member' and 'Associate' tier affiliations only.
The board shall consist of a minimum of one Fellow Conservation Architect and two Member Conservation Architects.

During the vetting of applications, an interview may be requested and conducted should any clarifications to any application for affiliation be deemed necessary by the Board of Admissions. The Board can partially accept an application, in that it accepts the affiliation of an applicant but at a lower tier than that applied for. The Board can also, upon review of an application, fully accept an application but recommend affiliation at a higher tier. In such occurrences, the Board shall notify the applicant in writing through its registrar, and request confirmation of the applicant's interest to be affiliated at the recommended tier.

Where an application is refused or not fully / partially accepted, the Board of Admissions shall formalise their decision and provide both the reason for its decision and recommendation for reapplication.

Upon recommendation from the Policy Committee on Heritage or the Board of Admissions, the Kamra tal-Periti may invite or induct established conservation architects in the Chapter at the appropriate level. The Council of the Kamra may however still impose requirements such as the submission of an application and the renewal of affiliation.



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Should an applicant feel that the decision of the Board of Admissions in their regard was not correct or fair, they can plea a revision of the decision in line with the revision plea outlined in the Monitoring and Enforcement section.
