



APPROVED FRAMEWORK FOR THE CHAPTER OF CONSERVATION ARCHITECTS

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MONITORING & ENFORCEMENT

While the Board of Admissions and the Policy Committee on Heritage are not responsible for active monitoring of architects and civil engineers, or enforcement of disciplinary measures, they shall remain vigilant to the ongoing within the local scene.

The purpose of such vigilance is to safeguard the standard and reputation of the Chapter of Conservation Architects, by ensuring that action is taken on any malpractice and controversial projects that concern the built heritage, that are either reported or have reached the public domain. The Kamra tal-Periti, through the Policy Committee on Heritage, shall analyse and determine whether such practises or projects may have a negative impact on the Chapter or the Kamra tal-Periti.

Such analysis would involve the study of the documentation available, philosophy and practice adopted and whether infringements to the Code of Practice adopted by the Chapter have occurred.

The Board of Admission holds the executive power to revoke or suspend any affiliation status with the Chapter, be it Associate, Member or Fellow. The Kamra tal-Periti reserves the right to take further disciplinary measures affecting the warrant and professional conduct of the professional in question, that shall remain the remit of the Kamra tal-Periti according to the current law and legal framework. The Board of Admissions and the Policy Committee on Heritage may and shall be requested to provide feedback to the Kamra on such matters.
